An online survey.



1519 Canadian residents aged 18+.



Completed between 17th to the 19th of May 2024, inclusive, using Leger's online panel.



Typically, a margin of error is not associated with a non-probability sample (i.e. a web panel in this case). For comparative purposes, though, a probability sample of 1519 respondents would have a margin of error of ±2.5%, 19 times out of 20.

Detailed Results:



A majority (70%) support taking the carbon tax off natural gas and propane for farmers.

Two-in-five (39%) strongly support taking off the carbon tax on natural gas and propane for farmers, while three-in-ten (31%) somewhat support it. Less than one-in-five (15%) oppose taking off the carbon tax. Those who support taking off the carbon tax are more likely to be men, Canadians 35+ in age, those living in rural areas (77% vs. 70% of Urbanites and 68% of suburban dwellers and Caucasian Canadians (73% vs. 63% of BIPoC Canadians). Regionally, those in British Columbia and Alberta are more likely to strongly support taking off the carbon tax compared to those in Quebec.
